Abstract

This report details my participation in ICRTTH 2026, which was held in Miri, Sarawak, Malaysia. The conference was jointly organized and hosted by the Sarawak Research Society and the Ministry of Tourism, Creative Industry and Performing Arts Sarawak (MTCP Sarawak). The event was also co-hosted by Responsible Borneo and Curtin University Malaysia (Miri Campus). At the same time, UN Tourism (formerly UNWTO) attended as a supporting organization. The event was held at Eastwood Valley Golf & Country Club, located in Lot 1379, Block 17, Jalan Miri By-Pass, 98000 Miri, Sarawak

The event brought together scholars, researchers, and industry professionals to discuss current issues and emerging developments in responsible hospitality and tourism. The event's theme was *Digital Innovations and Human Interactions for Meaningful Impacts through Responsible Tourism*. My main objectives for attending were to increase the visibility of National Kaohsiung University of Hospitality and Tourism (NKUHT), build professional connections, explore opportunities for future research partnerships, and contribute to academic discussions through the presentation of my executive abstract titled "*From Visible Marginality to Responsible Tourism Value: Digital-Human Synergy in Zanzibar Seaweed-based Marine Agritourism.*"

The program featured keynote speeches, panel discussions, workshops, and networking sessions involving participants from across the Asia-Pacific, Australia, and beyond. Through these activities, I gained valuable insights into emerging research directions and innovative industry practices. The event also provided opportunities to exchange knowledge with scholars and practitioners from diverse backgrounds. Based on this experience, this report proposes several recommendations to strengthen NKUHT's presence at global academic events, expand faculty and student participation, and foster collaborative research and educational initiatives.

1. Purpose

I submitted my executive abstract paper to ICRTTH 2026 and attended the conference with the following objectives:

1. *Elevating Institutional Global Footprint*: Represented the National Kaohsiung University of Hospitality and Tourism (NKUHT), showcasing its research presence in responsible tourism and sustainable development on an international stage,
2. *Disseminating and Advancing Scholarly Research*: Presented empirical research on Zanzibar's seaweed farming tours to gather international expert feedback, refining the study's methodology for publication in a high-impact journal.
3. *Synthesizing Emerging Paradigms and Industry Trends*: To acquire insights into smart tourism, digital transformation, and the blue economy to enrich future research and academic curricula.
4. *Cultivating Strategic International Collaborations*: Establish strategic professional networks with global researchers and policymakers to lay the foundation for joint publications and cross-institutional academic partnerships with NKUHT.
5. *Catalyzing Academic Capacity and Policy Contribution*: Enhance advanced research, presentation, and analytical skills to support doctoral pathways and generate evidence-based insights for sustainable tourism policy and livelihood resilience in Tanzania.

The conference program consisted of the following main activities. My participation mainly focused on academic presentations, research discussions, networking events, and other professional development activities like fieldwork.

Preparation Phase: Before the conference, I finalized my research paper (executive abstract), reviewed the conference program, and prepared supporting materials related to my research, “From Visible Marginality to Responsible Tourism Value: Digital-Human Synergy in Zanzibar Seaweed-based Marine Agritourism.”

Conference Participation:

1. *Keynote Speeches and Panel Sessions:* I attended keynote speeches and panel discussions that addressed current developments, challenges, and future directions in hospitality and tourism education, research, and industry practice.
2. *Academic Presentations:* The conference used a gallery-themed presentation style, which gave chances to showcase my research to different audiences from various walks of life multiple times.
3. *Research Discussion:* I presented my paper and engaged in discussions with conference participants. The feedback received from scholars offered valuable suggestions for further refining the study.
4. *Networking and Knowledge Exchange:* The conference provided many opportunities to engage with academics, students, and industry professionals from different countries and regions. I participated in several events, including MeetSEARA, which offered insights into scholarly publishing and facilitated interaction among participants. These exchanges contributed to the development of professional networks and potential future research collaborations.

Post-Conference Follow-up: Following the conference, I reviewed the knowledge and materials I acquired during the event, reflected on the feedback I received on my research, and

maintained communication with newly established contacts for future academic exchange and collaboration.

3. Experience and Suggestions

Experience: Attending the International Conference on Responsible Tourism and Hospitality (ICRTH) 2026 served as a transformative milestone in my academic development. The forum provided profound insights into contemporary research paradigms, emerging industry challenges, and innovative practices reshaping the global hospitality and tourism landscape. Engaging with high-level keynote addresses, empirical presentations, and industry impact stories significantly broadened my comprehension of sustainable and resilient tourism ecosystems.

A primary highlight of this participation was presenting my research paper, which offered a critical platform to solicit constructive peer review from international scholars. This scholarly exchange provided invaluable feedback to refine the study's theoretical framework and methodology for future journal publication. Furthermore, the conference facilitated strategic networking opportunities with leading academics, practitioners, and fellow researchers, establishing a robust foundation for future cross-institutional collaborations.

Most notably, my research contributions were formally recognized by the scientific committee, culminating in receiving both the **Best Paper** and **Best Presentation** awards. Achieving this dual honor at my inaugural international conference underscores the academic rigor and practical relevance of the research being produced.

The experiential learning was further enriched by technical field studies conducted at Niah National Park and Piassau Nature Reserve. These excursions offered an excellent empirical basis for executing a comparative analysis of conservation methodologies across diverse geographic and structural contexts, specifically drawing parallels between protected area management strategies in Tanzania, Malaysia, and Taiwan. Ultimately, this conference participation succeeded as both a profound educational milestone and a catalyst for future scholarly contributions to sustainable tourism policy.

Suggestions:

1. *Increase Financial Support for Conference Participation:* The current funding is highly appreciated as it gives students the urge to participate in conferences. A point to note here is that international conferences provide valuable opportunities for both industry and future academic collaborations. NKUHT could offer (increase) more funding to

support both faculty and students' participation through conference travel grants and presentation funding.

2. *Establish Pre-Conference Peer-Review and Presentation Panels.* It is recommended that the university implement department-level, internal mock presentation panels for graduate students ahead of major international forums. Establishing a structured "dry run" environment will allow student delegates to receive constructive, multi-disciplinary feedback before departure. This proactive measure will optimize the academic rigor of NKUHT submissions, elevate presentation quality, and better prepare students to confidently defend their empirical work on global stages.
3. *Institutionalize an Academic Knowledge-Transfer Framework:* To maximize the institutional return on investment from international conference travel, the university should create a formal platform where returning delegates host specialized workshops or research seminars. Through these sessions, students can systematically share newly acquired insights on emerging industry paradigms with the wider NKUHT academic community, thereby enriching current curricula and inspiring peer research.
4. *Provide Targeted Post-Conference Editorial Support for High-Impact Publications:* Winning research accolades at international conferences presents a prime opportunity to elevate NKUHT's global citation metrics. The university should allocate targeted administrative and editorial resources, such as advanced academic writing bootcamps or statistical consultation services, specifically to assist award-winning students in converting their conference papers into manuscripts for high-impact, peer-reviewed journals. This structured support will effectively accelerate the bridge between initial empirical presentation and final global publication
