While participating in such events is undeniably valuable, the costs associated with these trips—especially for accommodations near the venue—can sometimes be a challenge for students. In this instance, staying further from the venue resulted in longer commutes and additional expenses, which limited the time available to engage fully in all conference activities.

It might be beneficial to consider exploring ways in which the university can support students with financial assistance or funding options that cover both travel and accommodation expenses. This would help alleviate some of the financial pressures and allow students to focus entirely on the academic and networking opportunities that such conferences offer. By streamlining these logistics, more students would likely be encouraged

to participate in these global events, contributing to their professional development while further enhancing NKUHT's international visibility and presence.

I would also like to express my sincere gratitude to NKUHT for supporting this incredible opportunity. The chance to attend and present at such a prestigious conference has been invaluable to my academic and personal development.
